

## DIY KNITTING: HOW TO MAKE 1/1 RIBS IN KNITTING?

Discover in this free video tutorial how to make 1/1 ribs in knitting. 1/1 rib stitch is an essential stitch in knitting, it is the easiest rib to knit. It is a little elastic, that's why it is very used to form the edges of the knit or a hat, as well as the beginning of the sleeves, necklines ...

Knitting is a manual activity far from being a has-been. On the contrary, it is totally trendy. It is one of the favorite creative hobbies of women creators, it is even addictive. You will love to make DIY projects with this 1/1 rib stitch.

### *How to make a 1/1 rib in knitting?*

To knit 1/1 ribbing, you need to alternate a purl stitch on the same row, then a knit stitch, and so on until the end of the row. You can see the "right side" and "wrong side" rows that are formed on the work.

Be sure to watch the arrangement of the stitches when you change rows. If you have an even number of stitches, start all your rows the same way. But if you have an odd number of stitches, if you end a row with a purl stitch, you must start your new row with a knit stitch.

How to recognize purl and right side stitches? The purl stitch looks like a small "v". The purl stitch forms a mini ball. For knitting beginners, practice knitting the 1/1 rib stitch on a sweater, hat, snood or scarf. Get creative ideas from our free knitting tutorials.

## steps

### ★ Step 1/3

Knit a "right side" stitch. Pass the yarn to the front.

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### ★ Step 2/3

Knit a purl stitch.

Reminder: to **make a purl stitch**, with the right needle, you stitch from right to left in the first stitch (from the bottom to the top). The right needle is on the left needle. Then, the thread is wrapped by passing it above and below the right needle.

The stitch is pulled up (the stitch on the left needle is dropped). A new stitch is slipped onto the right needle.

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### ★ Step 3/3

Once your "purl" stitch is done, pass your yarn behind the right needle. Then, continue alternating "right side" and "wrong side" stitches until the end of the row.

It is important not to forget to pass your yarn between the two needles towards the front or back depending on the stitch you are going to make.
