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Which bead colors to choose in 2022?

This spring, choose from our selection of Miyuki delicas 11.00 beads to create your woven bracelets without presentation! Below is a list of beads in trendy 2022 colors. These Miyuki bead shades will match most of the new collections of ready-to-wear brands. Have fun creating beaded jewelry to match your new outfit! This spring's colors are mostly bright pastel hues, but a few pastel colors will bring a little sweetness. After the darkness of winter, these pastel shades will bring brightness and pizzazz to your look. We didn't put them in this list, but the lemon yellow plus did pattern on a black background is also very present and will really please who prefer colors to pastel colors. But don't forget to add a touch of bright color to cheer you up! Several shades of green will also be present. We chose one for this selection, but you can choose Kelly green or baby green. After all, spring is the season of plants and women. So the new line also comes with baby blue and green. 1- Fuchsia Pink and Powder Pink

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Two contrasting shades of pink will bring a vintage feel to your design. Rosewater is reminiscent of childhood sweetness, rose buds, romance and discretion, while Fuchsia is reminiscent of the boldness of the 80's and the joy of being it's up to you to decide what suits you best. 2- Cobalt Blue and Emerald Green

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Cobalt blue refers to an element of the periodic table, Caball 27. Through a chemical reaction with aluminum salts, a blue pigment is obtained which has been used since the 1800's even though traces of this pigment can be found in antiquity. In fact, several shades of cobalt blue can be used with this process. In fashion, Cobalt Blue refers to a very vivid blue with a violet tinge. It is a deep color that is both vivid, but without being too 'jumpy'. A great color for people who want to try out bright colors, but without overdoing it. This spring, pair it with emerald green or [available here](#) and a little white to bring out the blue. [Cobalt blue](#) to find the exact origin of Kelly Green, some sources mention the correlation between the name Kelly very common in Ireland and the Irish green. A little green would do you good? Flame red and tangerine orange are used to make beautiful creations only by combining shades.
