We have several basic models of pilers available on the site. Some come in kits of 3 or more. The key is to choose pilers that fit your hands. Some of these pilers are very small and are perfect for slipping into a bag for a trip, but they won't necessarily be pleasant and practical if you want to make several pieces of jewelry a week. In our list of materials, we've chosen affordable pilers suited to the hands of the majority of our customers.

If you're looking or better quality or pilers for larger hands, these may not be the best choice. As these 3 types of pilers are widely used in costume jewelry, there are many small variations from one to another. For example, some designers choose <u>flat-nosed pilers with angled tips,</u> instead of the classic flat-nosed pilers. After that, it's up to you to experiment with other pilers.

#### 3- Choosing the right wire for jewelry-making

There are different wire materials: copper, brass, gold filled, sliver 925, stainless steel. Depending on the material, we can offer you different hardnesses and options. Some materials have more options available than others. The wire used here is copper wire, galvanized gold-plated (i.e. a layer of gold) and coated with an anti-tarnish variable to protect the gold. This is one of the highest-quality wires among the less expensive options.

#### ★ Step 1/2

I also offer a variation of these earrings, available in different colors, so that you can customize your creations to suit your desires. Feel free to explore all the options available to create unique earrings that reflect your style! You'll find the different pearl shades in the "variation" section of the equipment list.

For this version. I used:

- Opaque resin beads 4 mm Duck blue x4
- Opaque resin beads 6 mm Duck blue x8
- Opaque resin bead 8 mm Duck blue x6
- Flower rondelle beads 4 mm Gold-plated x4
- Flower stud earrings 12x10 mm with closed ring -Gold-plated x2
- Rocaille Miyuki Duracoat 8/0 4203 Galvanized Yellow Gold





### ★ Step 2/2

For even more variations on your creations, I suggest black earrings with drop-shaped studs, but always in gold tones.

For this version, I used:

- · Opaque resin beads 4 mm black x4
- Opaque resin beads 6 mm black x8
- Opaque resin bead 8 mm black x6
- Flower rondelle beads 4 mm gold-plated x4
- Stud earrings textured drop 12x10 mm with closed ring - Gilded with fine gold x2
- Rocaille Miyuki Duracoat 8/0 4203 Galvanized Yellow Gold
