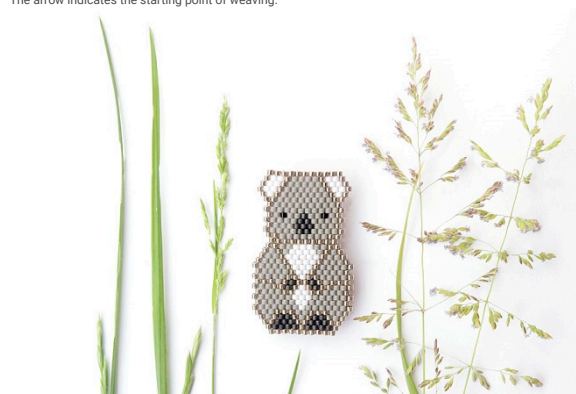

We love this weaving koala made with beads miyuki 11/0. Thanks to Virginie from the "Pistachio Star" blog, make a little koala family. This weave will be perfect to be mounted on a brooch and to hang on a loose sweater or jacket for this fall / winter. This weaving can be done with brickstitch or peyote techniques. For beginners, do not hesitate to read our fact sheets to learn how to weave pearls. Many thanks to Virginie for sharing the diagram.



The arrow indicates the starting point of weaving.



Here are the references of Miyuki pearls 11/0 recommended by the designer :

For the big Koala (the big koala is clearer than the little one)

gray body: DB-1589  
contour line: DB-0038  
the ears and stain on the belly: DB-0357  
eyes: DB-0010

nose + hands + feet: DB-0306  
reflection on the nose: BD-1156

For the little Koala  
gray body: DB-0761  
contour line: DB-0038  
the ears and stain on the belly: DB-0357  
eyes: DB-0010

nose + hands + feet: DB-0306

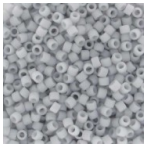

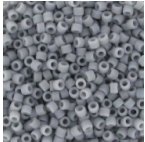

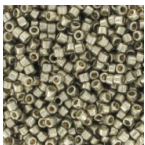
