

DIY ELASTIC KEY RING BRACELET WITH XXL SILICONE BEADS

How to make an elastic key ring bracelet?

If, like me, you have a phobia of dropping your apartment keys when you take your trash cans to the dumpster or when you walk your dog, here is the solution: A key ring bracelet . This tuto will take you 5 minutes and you will have the spirit freed! Guaranteed effect;)! Moreover, your keys will be easier to find in the house or in your bag. To make this DIY minute, no need for specific tools: Glue and a pair of scissors are enough. For the rest of the material, find it at the bottom of this page with lots of color options. I used silicone beads with a matte finish and 15mm wooden beads. The wooden beads have a big hole in them so you can hide the knot in the elastic thread. So consider using these beads if you want a nice finish. The hole in the silicone beads will be too small to fit the knot through.

Which material to use for DIY Elastic key ring bracelet with XXL silicone beads?

steps

★ Step 1/4

Cut a piece of wire about 37 cm long. Then stretch the thread to loosen it. Elastic threads always stretch a little at first. The trick is to force them to relax before you string the beads and make the knot. String 7 silicone beads and 7 wooden beads and test the bracelet on your wrist to see if it is enough. The bracelet should not be tight. If it is too tight, add more wooden beads. Once the bracelet is the right size, make a surgeon's knot: Instead of making a classic simple knot where you pass the wire once around each other, pass it twice. Squeeze and then retie the knot 2 more times, squeezing hard each time and squeezing the wires from the inside of the bracelet as well.



★ Step 2/4

Put a generous amount of glue on the knot and cut the wire ends at about 4 mm from the knot. Then slide the wooden bead over the knot until the wire ends are completely hidden.



★ Step 3/4

Prepare the carabiner with the keys. Thread the ring through the slot on the bottom of the carabiner. Then slide your keys into the ring. You can now attach the carabiner to the bracelet. If you no longer wish to use the bracelet, you can simply unhook the carabiner.





★ Step 4/4

You can also add a tassel to the bracelet. Take a large open ring, open it by twisting the ends with a pair of pliers and put it through the centre of the pompom. Then close the ring around the thread of the bracelet. To add the pompom you will need jewellery pliers. There are also tassels with a loop that you can thread directly like a bead.
