How to make an easy multi-row bracelet?

New products, new products! Yes, because it's always an awaited moment at Perles&Co, we have the pleasure to share with you today the tutorials of the month's collection. And this time, you will have understood it is zircon that it is about! A beautiful material that is

Thanks to this tutorial, you can make a 2 in 1 jewel, which can be worn as a bracelet or as a necklace. To do this, take your measurements and adapt them so that they correspond to both two or three turns of the wrist as well as a more or less long turn of the neck according to your preferences.

As for the colour, we propose a sweet marriage between pearls with pinkish nuances and golden pearls. Of course, you are free to modify the colors by choosing among all the references of <u>Kalos glass beads by Puca</u>, and all the references of Miyuki seed beads 8/0 available on our site.

To make this multi-row bracelet, we chose to mix several of our favorite beads and primers: Miyuki golden seed beads, zircon charms and spacers, Kalos by Puca and a buoy clasp. Well beyond its function as a clasp, the buoy model is today the star element of a jewel and easily takes the central place in the creation. Which material to use for Kalos beads bracelet by Puca, Miyuki beads and zircon charms?

Crimp covers 3 mm Gilded with fine 24K x50

Crimp tubes 1.5x1.6 mm fine Gold plated x250

13mm Buoy clasp for bracelet or necklace - fine Gold plated x1

steps



★ Step 1/5

Measure the thread by making 4 turns around your wrist to have 2 threads per row at the end to insert the puca beads which are composed of 2 holes. Cut this wire in 2 then hung the 2 ends to the clasp and inserted them in the same stone to crush then add a cover.





★ Step 2/5

String the beads in this order:

- 1 gold bead (which takes the 2 wires)
- 1 pink gold Puca bead
- 2 gold beads (one on each thread)
- 1 pink gold Puca bead





★ Step 3/5

Let's continue by putting in this order:

- 1 gold bead
- 1 Puca gold bead
- 1 compass rose charm
- 1 Puca gold bead
- 1 gold bead

Repeat step 2 and step 3 without the charm, alternating the puca gold and lila beads every other time.







★ Step 4/5

Continue to string the beads until you are just under halfway through. Then thread the first zircon. Then halfway through put on the second wind rose charm





★ Step 5/5

Repeat the assembly of beads until symmetry is achieved.

Then attach the end to the clasp following the same technique as step 1

And here is an elegant and simple bracelet to make!
