

MULTI THREAD BRACELET WITH RED SEED BEADS

How to make a multi-row bracelet with lots of seed beads?

Who hasn't spent hours stringing beads one by one to make a simple necklace or bracelet? This new needle will make this activity much more enjoyable and faster. Indeed, if you want to string a single color of beads or a mixture of colors, this needle will save you time. You'll have to get the hang of it. You'll need to make quick, dry little back and forth movements like at the end of the video presentation, with the example of the 11/0 delicas. I go much faster at this point and it works even better. The video is in real speed.

There is also a tool that allows you to string beads quickly: The bead mill. The disadvantage of the latter is that it tends to send beads flying everywhere, it is a bit expensive and the needle that is used with it has a very small eye. But you can test both to get an idea and choose the tool that suits you best. Each has its advantages and disadvantages. The flexible eye of the quick threading needle allows for a wide choice of thread diameters, but remember to check that your thread can pass through the bead hole twice easily.

For this bracelet, I used 15/0 miyuki seed beads, 11/0 miyuki seed beads, 11/0 delicas and 8/0 miyuki seed beads. The needle is a little less advantageous with the 8/0's, as they are much easier to thread by hand than the 15/0's or 11/0's but you can still use this needle. The needle will work with other brands of beads as well. It works especially well on 15/0!

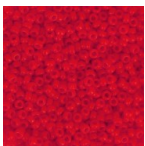

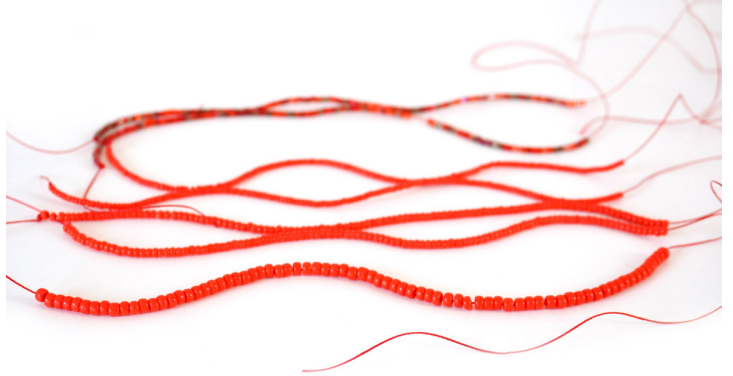

steps

★ Step 1/6

Cut 50 cm of thread and make a **loose** double knot 15 cm from the end. This double knot will be used to block the beads, but you will remove it later. There is also a tool that is used to temporarily block the wire: The bead stopper.

Thread 2 threads of delicas 11/0, 2 threads of rocailles 15/0, 2 threads of rocailles 11/0 and 1 thread of rocailles 8/0. You can make more or less strands as you like. Make the strands of beads the length of your wrist. They should all be the same size.



★ Step 2/6

Untie the knots and gather the threads. Tie them together at 15 cm from the end.



★ Step 3/6

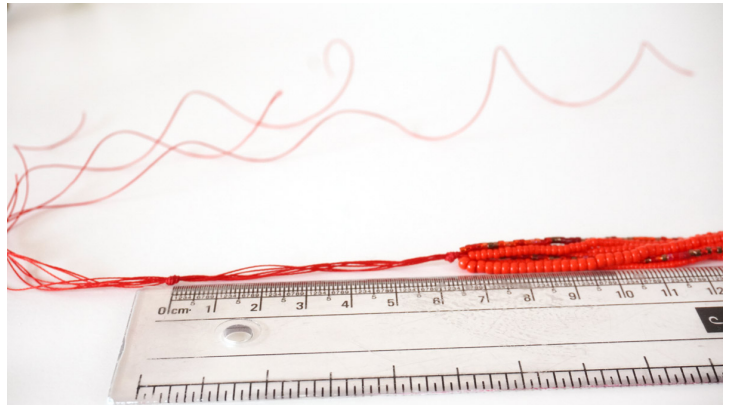
Pack the beads on the threads against the first knot and tie a knot on the other side.



★ Step 4/6

Tie a knot 7 cm from the first knot, on each side of the bracelet. Before tightening, make sure the bracelet fits easily on your wrist (not your hand) with this margin because we will make a slip knot. You can also braid the wire before making these knots, for a more finished result.

Tighten the knots by pulling on each thread.



★ Step 5/6

Trim excess wire after the knots, 5 mm from the knot. Burn the ends of the wire with a lighter and extinguish the flame using the lighter. This will bind the yarn together and replace the glue. Cut a new 20 cm piece of wire. Tie it on the two crossed ends of the bracelet. The new piece of wire should be the same length on each side.



★ Step 6/6

Make a sliding knot twisted over 1 cm. It's like the classic macramé overhand knot, but instead of alternating the direction of the two wires, you always use the same direction. Cut the wire at 5 mm from the knot and burn it.



Result
