

## MICRO MACRAMÉ CUFF BRACELET TUTORIAL WITH SLAM CORD

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#### Which thread for the micro macramé?

Want to learn the micro-macramé technique to make jewelry? You are at the right place! Discover in this tutorial, proposed by our partner Anne Coulais aka Tat'Anne, how to make a micro-macramé cuff bracelet with an integration of Rocailles Miuyki beads and an oval cabochon in the center of the bracelet. The technique of micro-macramé is identical to that of macramé, but with thinner wire as you can imagine from its name. It allows you to make very fine jewelry, especially with the wire used in the tutorial: the slam cord.

Anne Coulais offers you the realization of this bracelet in micro-macramé in shades of brown, gold and turquoise. You are free to use your imagination and make this bracelet in the colors of your choice. Also, the wire size chosen by our partner is 0.6 mm. You can also choose 0.8 mm or 1 mm wire if you find that the 0.6 mm wire is too thin. However, you should know that the larger the diameter of the wire, the more difficult it is to fit it into the groove of the cabochon. It is possible to use a thicker wire, but you will have to make sure that the wire is well glued to the cabochon so that it is well consolidated.

### Which material to use for Micro macramé cuff bracelet tutorial with slam cord?

Cube beads 2.5 mm - Fine Gold plated x10

Ref.: ETA-309 Quantity: 1



0.6mm Flat waxed polyester thread - Slam Cord for micro macramé - Cocoa x100m

Ref. : FIO-412 Quantity : 1



2,5 mm ball beads for DIY jewelry creation - Fine Gold Plated x100

Ref. : MET-791 Quantity : 1



Miyuki Seed beads 11/0 193 - 24kt Gold Light Plated x5g

Jewel Glue Hasulith 30ml

Oval cabochon - Grooved stone for macrame 25x18 mm Genuine Turquoise x1


### steps

#### ★ Step 1/1

For step 19, we'll go down a full row to the middle of the bracelet. To do this, take the uppermost thread on the left of the bracelet and wrap the threads around it twice each time. This is a macramé knot. For those who are new to micro-macramé, you can consult our <u>technical</u> data sheet, which will teach you how to make this type of knot.

Next, take the two middlemost wires and thread a gold bead, keeping the wires in the same direction, i.e. from top to bottom. Continue with another full row of macramé knots downwards. Don't forget to go all the way to the end, taking the bead thread as well. Do the same on both sides, taking the two middle wires and knotting them to secure the bead.

Next, we'll reduce the width of the bracelet. To do this, leave out the highest wire on each side. Then repeat a full row of macramé knots on each side.
