#### How to make Indian pearl earrings?

Jhumka earrings, known for their bell-shaped silhouette, have been an essential part of traditional Indian jewelry for centuries. They are believed to bring luck and prosperity to the wearer. They are therefore a very common traditional gift. In the past, they were mostly made of gold or silver and richly decorated with precious stones and pearls. In the popular series "The Bridgerton Chronicle", one of the main characters in season 2, a native of India, regularly wears Jhumka in his ears, along with other fine jewelry.

Today, these domed or umbrella-shaped ear rings are a regular feature of fashion, both in India and abroad. These elegant earrings can be adapted in many different ways. For this summer, we're proposing two models of dangling pearl ear rings inspired by Indian Jhumka. They invite themselves into your wardrobe in a more refined form. For a contemporary approach, opt for colorful, monochrome seed bead Jhumkas. In this tutorial, the blue beads are 11/0 seed beads by Preciosa Ornella. They are available in a palette of bright or pastel colors. This modern version can be perfectly matched with more casual outfits like cropped jeans and a white t-shirt, bringing a touch of exoticism and originality.

For summer evenings, choose the pearly pearl long ear rings model and pair it with a flowing maxi dress for a bohemian chic look, or dare to contrast by wearing them with a highly structured outfit for a sophisticated effect. Don't hesitate to personalize your earrings with your favorite colors.

For the pearly version, use the products listed at the top of the equipment list. For the blue version, use references ROC-430, ACC-513, OHR-288, COL-761. These products are listed in the product variations section of the parts list. You need 24 studs to make a pair of earrings with Jhumka 12-hoop pendants and 32 studs to make a pair of earrings with Jhumka 16-hoop pendants.

#### ★ Step 1/4

Straighten the nails with flat-nose pliers, if possible with nylon tips, if they are not completely straight. Thread 10 pearls on the nails for the blue version and 30 pearls for the pearly version. The nails used in the photo of the blue version are ACC-513 nails (26x0.5 mm), but you can use any nail with a shank thickness of less than 0.7 mm and a length greater than 25 mm.

Bend the nail at right angles to the last bead threaded. Cut back the end of the nail a little to shorten it. You should keep about 8 mm.



#### Step 2/4

Next, form a small loop with very fine round pliers. To do this, grasp the end of the rod with the ends of the pliers and wrap the rod around the end of the pliers in the opposite direction to the angle.





#### 🛊 Step 3/4

Attach the beaded nail to a ring on the bell pendant. Do the same for all the remaining rings.



#### Step 4/4

Open the ring of the ethnic ear stud using two jewelry pliers, holding the base of the ring welded to the stud and opening the other part. In this way, you avoid weakening the ring's weld. Slide in the dome and close the ring in the same way.

For the other earring, use a junction ring to connect the two parts of the loop.
