How to make a Brick Stitch bracelet with Miyuki Deluxo feathers and beads?

The hippie-chic style is timeless and is regularly coming back at every days approach. We offer this tutorial to learn how to make a Brick Stitch jumper with a triangle pattern with feathers.

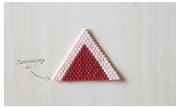


STEP 1: The weaving

To achieve this weaving, the "Brick Stitch" technique must used.

Tip and advice of the designer:
- Always start your weaving with an odd line so that the thread at the beginning of the line and at the end are not on the same side of this line.

- Then use a beading needle that opens at its center. This will be more convenient to weave because the needle is more malleable: the wire will be much easier to put on.

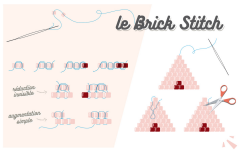


How to make the first Brick Stitch weaving line?

First, start by threading the first two beads. Then, run the yarn into the first bead to create a loop yarn thread the third bead and run the yarn into the previous bead. Continue this action for each pearl in the first row. After this, your first line is normally over. To help you, refer to the diagram below.

Weaving Brick Stitch: How to make an invisible reduction?

Thread two beads and pass your needle under the thread connecting the second and the third pearl of the line below. Then, run your thread in the two beads in the opposite direction. Your thread is now in the first pearl. Now move your needle through the second bead from bottom to top. For the third bead, pass your needle under the thread connecting the third and fourth bead and then run it in the bead in the opposite direction. Repeat this action until the end of the line.



To finish the weave, run the thread inside the beads to create a knot to lock the thread. Cut it flush with the weave.

Advice from the designer Charlotte: To make your job easier and simplify your weaving, tighten the thread after each action!

STEP 2: The drawing

Now cut 2 feathers (feathers and 2 black feathers) 3 cm and 4 cm high. You can refer to the image below. Cut the bottom of the feather perpendicularly, then remove the excess feathers / threads by hand.



Glue the back of the weave to solidify it and at the same time paste the feathers harmoniously. Do not hesitate to be generous in glue to make sure of the solidity of the base!

Charlotte's tip: When you glue the top of the weaving, do not stick the top of the weaving to the base. To make the front of the necklace look prettier and cleaner, stick a triangle rectangle over the feathers.



STEP 3: The string

Now for the ring: To hold them, use wire to secure the ring in the middle of the two beads at each end as shown below. Run the thread twice in the beads to create a knot and so secure the ring. Then repeat this action at each end of both weaves.



Charlotte's Tip: Thread the thread twice through the ring to solidify the knot. Do not try to pass the thread through the beads too many times because they could break. So make only two knots no more!

Charlotte's tip: When you slide your ring into the bead, make sure the opening is centered to prevent the ring from coming off the weave as you manipulate it to put the chain in afterwards.

Cut the chain into two chains of a length of 30cm then slide them in each ring and close them. At the other end of each chain, slip a ring so you can put a clasp on one side and the extension chain on the other. Then close the rings.



Charlotte's tip: Be careful where you put the clasp according to whether you're left-handed or right-handed!

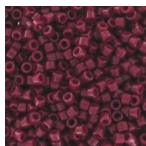
