

VINTAGE DOUBLE-LINK BRACELET WITH AURORA CRYSTAL SETTING

How to make a vintage bracelet with Aurora crystals?

Vintage jewelry has been the big trend for a few seasons now. With the festive season fast approaching, we decided to create a new collection combining vintage jewelry and crystals: Le Bal d'Hiver. This jewelry set takes us straight to a London ball worthy of The Bridgerton Chronicle, don't you think? This new collection is perfect for accessorizing your festive outfits for the fast-approaching holiday season! You can also give the materials to make one of these tutorials as a gift for a passionate designer, or make them yourself.

In this tutorial, discover how to make a vintage double-link bracelet with Aurora-set crystal. To make this piece of jewelry, you'll need Aurora crystal A4627, two lengths of brass fancy chain, two weaving tips, a lobster clasp, round head nails and open rings. For the tools, you'll need cutting pliers, flat-nose pliers and round-tipped pliers for forming loops. This tutorial is accessible to beginners and is quick to complete. You can also personalize your bracelet! Here are two variations: one with a dark red crystal and one with a grey crystal. The <u>Aurora A4627</u> 18x13 mm <u>crystal-set</u> reference also exists in several other colors, which you can find in the product variations, under the list of materials. All you have to do is choose your favorite! So, grab your pliers!

Which material to use for Vintage double-link bracelet with Gurora crystal setting?

SUPPLIES



4x0.8mm Open Jump Rings - European-made -fine Gold plated x50

Ref. : ACC-352 Quantity : 1



12mm Cymbal - 11/0 delica weaving end - Topolia II - Fine Gold plated x1

Ref. : ACT-761 Quantity : 2



6.5mm Fancy mesh chain with round rings - Gold x20cm

Ref. : CHR-866 Quantity : 2



Gold Tone lobster clasp 9.5mm x1

Ref.: FRM-693 Quantity: 1



Eye pin 50x0.7mm soft gold color x25

Ref. : OAC-065 Quantity : 1



18x13mm Aurora A4627 set crystal - Octagon - Gold - Ruby x1

Ref.: WST-598 Quantity: 1



steps

★ Step 1/12

Measure 6cm of chain. This measurement should be adapted according to the size of your wrist. In my case, my wrist is 14cm.




★ Step 2/12

Cut 4 pieces of 6 cm chain using wire cutters.



★ Step 3/12

Slide two round-headed nails through the holes in the back of the Aurora crystal.





★ Step 4/12

To make a loop, use wire cutters to cut about 2 cm off the round-headed nails.



★ Step 5/12

Using flat-nose pliers, bend the protruding part of the set crystal at 90°.



★ Step 6/12

Then form a loop with round-tipped pliers. If you don't know how to form a loop, you can consult our <u>How to form a loop on a nail or jewelry pin</u> datasheet <u>.</u>



★ Step 7/12

Open and slide an open ring onto one of the nail's loops. Repeat for the remaining three chain ends.





★ Step 8/12

Open and slide an open ring onto each end of your chains.



★ Step 9/12

Then attach a weaving tip to each side of your bracelet, closing your rings in the tip holes.



★ Step 10/12

The two end caps should be positioned like this.





★ Step 11/12

To finish, open and slide an open ring onto one of the two end pieces and add your clasp. Your bracelet is finished!



★ Step 12/12

This bracelet is of course customizable! I chose a gray Aurora setting for a second variation of the bracelet.



Result
