


## MIYUKI PINK BEADS NECKLACE AND BRACELET SET

#### How to make a Miyuki bead necklace and bracelet set?

Would you like to learn how to create your own handmade jewelry and create an elegant, feminine ensemble? This step-by-step tutorial shows you how to make a matching jewelry duo: a bracelet and necklace with Miyuki 11/0 beads, in soft pink and gold tones. This beginner-friendly project will take you just 20 minutes to complete. The charm of this set lies in the lovely blend between the light pink of Miyuki Opaque Carnation beads and the golden reflections of Galvanized Gold. A satin-finish Fine gold plated heart bead adds a romantic, precious touch to the necklace. This delicate jewel can be worn every day or given as a gift for a special occasion.

To make this set, you'll need just a few items: a set of pliers (cutting and flat), Miyuki 11/0 beads in Opaque Carnation and Galvanized Gold, nylon thread, a central heart bead and the necessary primers to finish your set. Remember to adjust the <u>length of the wire</u> to suit your neck and wrist size.

This easy-to-match set will match all your outfits and be a stylish addition to your back-to-school wardrobe. Simple, discreet and timeless, it adds a handmade touch to your style. You can give free rein to your creativity and create a unique piece of jewelry in your own image by changing the colors of the Miyuki beads. I'm proposing here a pink and gold version, as well as a beige and pink gold version, but given our wide choice of Miyuki 11/0 seed beads, you can personalize your creation to your taste!

## Which material to use for Miyuki pink beads necklace and bracelet set?

#### **SUPPLIES**



Jumprings open 5x0.7mm 316L gold-finished stainless steel x10

Ref. : ACC-736 Quantity : 1



3mm Crimp beads covers - Fine gold Plated x25

Ref. : ACC-896 Quantity : 1



8mm Stainless Steel 316L Spring clasp with closed ring - Gold plated x1

Ref. : CLS-004 Quantity : 2



Invisible nylon thread coil - illusion cord Supplemax 0.25 mm Transparent x50 m

Ref. : FC-690 Quantity : 1



2mm 316 Stainless Steel Round crimp beads - Gold Tone x25

Ref.: INX-339 Quantity: 1



Miyuki Seed beads 11/0 1052 - Galvanized Gold

Ref. : MR11/1052 Quantity : 1



Miyuki Seed beads Duracoat 11/0 4467 - Opaque Carnation x8g

Heart 7 mm satin Fine Gold Plated x1

### steps



### ★ Step 1/7

Start by cutting about 45 centimetres of nylon thread. This measurement should be adjusted according to the size of your neck.

Slide a Crimp bead into the thread, followed by a cord protector, then pass the thread back through the Crimp bead.

Use Crimp beads pliers to crush the bead.





### ★ Step 2/7

Slide a bead cover over the bead to be crushed and close it with flat-nose pliers, without pressing too hard.





#### ★ Step 3/7

Slide your beads halfway down your necklace, alternating pink and gold Miyuki beads.





#### ★ Step 4/7

When you reach the middle of your necklace, slide on the heart bead and string the Miyuki beads again.



#### ★ Step 5/7

To close your necklace, repeat steps 1 and 2. Then, using two pliers, open one ring and slide on the clasp. Add it to one end of the necklace and only one ring to the other.



### ★ Step 6/7

Repeat the same steps to make the bracelet version. You'll need to cut about 20cm of nylon thread for this one.





### ★ Step 7/7

This set is also available in beige and rose gold. You'll find the materials in the product variations, under the list of materials.
