Elastic cord Transparent 1mm x 30 m
Ref. : FC-364
Quantity : 1



Irregular cube beads 16x17 mm - Translucent acrylic -Marbled light pink x10
Ref. : KSF-102
Quantity : 1



Rhinestones Rondelle 6mm Gold tone/Crystal x4
Ref. : RS-031
Quantity : 3

steps

★ Step 1/6

To make these elastic bracelets, nothing could be simpler: thread the beads onto the elastic thread, here 10 pink cube beads, separated by 10 gold rhinestone rondelles.

To close the bracelet, tie a double surgeon's knot. It's just like a normal knot, except that instead of wrapping the wires once and tightening, you'll wrap the wires twice and then tighten.

Repeat step 2 to make a double surgeon's knot. Tighten securely. Tighten the inside of the bracelet as well. Cut the wire ends to within 2 mm of the knot. Apply glue to the knot and try to slide the knot through a bead hole to hide it.

For this bracelet, the references used are : KFS-102 x1 and RS-031 x3



★ Step 2/6

Repeat the same steps, but with other beads.
