

TUTORIAL: RESIN BEAD BRACELET WITH A GOLD CHAIN

How do you make a chain bracelet with resin beads?

Summer is the perfect season to get started on making jewelry: we're craving colors and all kinds of accessories to spruce up our outfits. This tutorial fits perfectly with our August theme, dedicated to easy summer jewelry, and shows you how to make a delicate bracelet combining a gold stainless steel chain with resin beads in soft, summery shades.

Accessible to everyone, even without any experience, this [beginner-friendly tutorial](#) takes just 15 minutes to complete and costs less than €20 in materials. It's a great way to discover the joy of making your own jewelry without breaking the bank—and to create a polished piece you'll be truly proud of.

For this bracelet, I've chosen simple yet distinctive materials: a lightweight yet durable gold-tone stainless steel chain with decorative links, accented with resin beads in two shapes—light marbled pink and marbled lichen—as well as a pretty imitation mother-of-pearl bead to add a touch of natural elegance. The entire piece is assembled with gold-plated stainless steel pins and rings for a cohesive and durable finish.

What makes this bracelet so endearing is precisely its unique, handcrafted look: the resin beads, with their slightly irregular shapes and shades, give each piece a character all its own. And if you'd like to personalize your creation, our website offers a wide selection of [resin beads](#) so you can design a bracelet that reflects your style.

7x1mm Stainless steel 316L open Jump rings - Gold Tone x10

Flat irregular bead 22x17 mm in translucent resin - Marbled lichen x1

7.4mm Stainless steel 304L fancy Chain - Gold Tone x98cm

Perles & Co Step 1/3

Start by sliding a round-headed pin through each bead, then form a loop with each pin. Be careful not to close the loops completely, in preparation for Step 2.

To make a loop:

Using wire cutters, cut the pin so that you have 2 cm of wire remaining. Then form a loop using round-nose pliers.

Perles & Co Step 2/3

Cut the chain links to be inserted between each bead. For my part, I chose:

- 4 chain links between the green and pink beads, as well as between the pink and pearlescent beads,
- 3 chain links following the green bead,
- 2 chain links after the pearlescent bead.

You'll find a photo of the finished bracelet in step 3.

To secure each section of the chain, use round-nose pliers to close the loops you started in step 1 on your chain links, connecting everything together.



Perles & Co Step 3/3

You can now attach a ring to one end and a ring with the Lobster Clasp to the other end.

Here is the finished bracelet!
