4x0.6mm Stainless steel 316L open Jump rings - Gold Tone x10

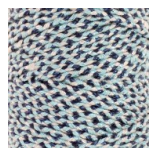

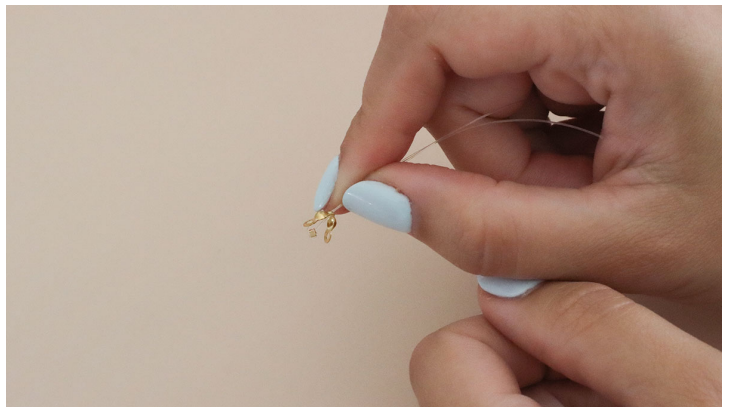
Perles & Co Step 1/3

We'll start with the first necklace—the one made of seed beads. To make it, cut a piece of thread that's long enough; here, I used 50 cm to give myself a little leeway. Next, take a crimp bead, thread it onto the wire, and pass the wire back through the same hole to form a loop. Flatten the crimp bead.

Next, take your knot cover and thread both ends of the string through it. Make sure the crimp bead is positioned inside the knot cover, then flatten it.

Now let's move on to the last necklace. To do this, cut the cord to the desired length—here, I cut 42.5 cm of cord. Next, take your Lobster Clasp with a round lace clip. Place the end of the cord against the clamp tip and flatten it using flat-nose pliers. Do the same on the other side.
