


## TASSEL EARRINGS WITH MIYUKI BEAD TIE WOVEN IN PEYOTE PAIR

How to create a tassel beaded tie?

How to weave peer peyote?

For those who love pompoms, you are in the right place. For those who love to weave Miyuki pearls and tassels, you are doubly in the right place! <a href="Estelle">Estelle</a> from the <a href="Petit Bout de Chou">Petit Bout de Chou</a> blog teaches us in this tutorial how to make <a href="Long pompoms">Long pompoms</a> earrings with <a href="Miyuki beaded">Miyuki beaded</a> ties woven in Peyote pair . This is a pair of very chic earrings that will be perfect to enhance a party outfit!

Before you start creating, we advise you to take a side turn of our toolbox where you will learn through synthetic diagrams  $\underline{\text{the}}$   $\underline{\text{technique of weaving Peyote pair}}$ .

The material necessary for the realization:



STEP 1: Ring in Peyote pair

Create a pattern (here a zigzag) with an even number of rows (here 8).





Thread the bead and make a loop to block it.







Thread the first 8 beads of the pattern and then the first pearl of the next row (you have 9 beads strung on).







Prick the needle into the 3rd bead from the end and pull on the thread to place the first two beads side by side.











Thread the next bead of the row and stitch into that of the previous row for the new pearl to be inserted.







Repeat until the end of the row and start again with the next row.













Train 5 zigzags (or more or less to go around your pompom).







"Sew" the ends of the ring together and weave through the work to block the wire.







STEP 2: Top of the tie

Bring out the thread at the top of the ring.








Divide the number of beads of the ring by 6 = X. Thread 13 beads and then transplant the needle X beads further.







Weave in the work to bring out X pearls further.








Repeat to create 3 loops of 13 beads.







Walk up through the last loop to the center bead and go through the other two loops twice in a row.







Thread 5 beads to create a new loop and iron in the loops until the peyote weave to block the thread.







STEP 4: Attach the tassel tie

Prick the needle through the pompon several times to attach the clip to it.







Block the thread in the weave.







STEP 5: Attach the ear hook to the clip

Open the hook ring with the pliers.







Slide the small loop inside and close it.







It's over! All you have to do is make the second loop!
